

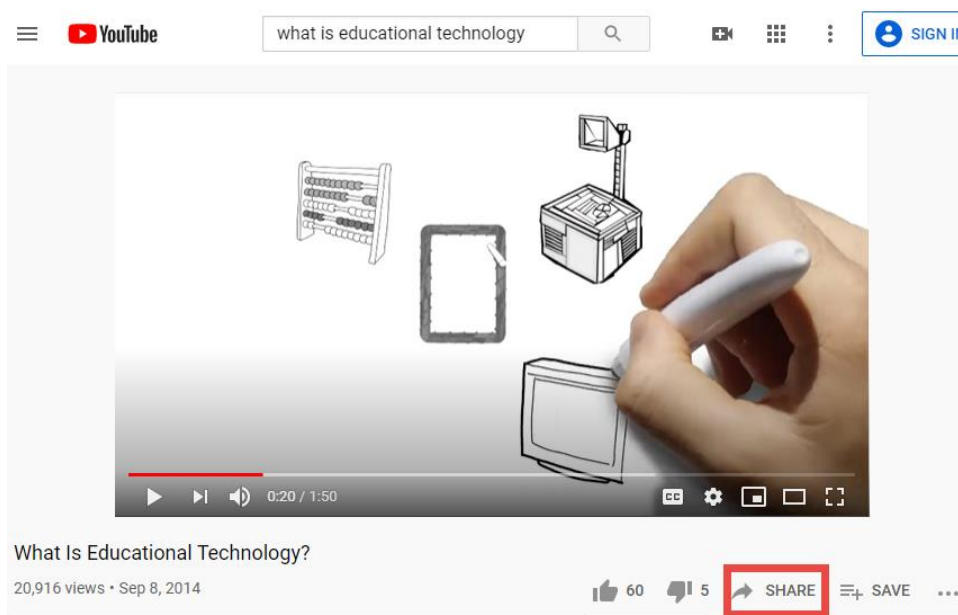

## How to Embed a YouTube Video as An Item:

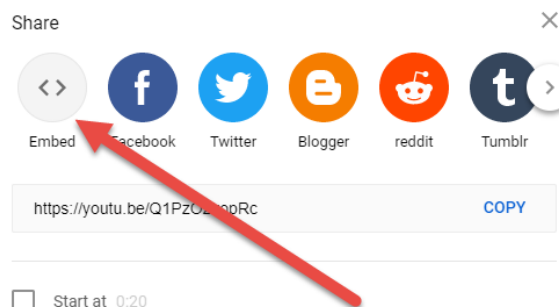
Adding a YouTube video as an “Item” to your course allows for a more visual approach than simply adding a web link.

### To Embed a YouTube Video as an Item:

1. Navigate to your YouTube video.
2. Click on the “**SHARE**” link below the video:



3. In the **Share** window click on the “**Embed**” icon:

4. In the **Embed Video** window select and copy all of the code (Ctrl+C, or right-click > Copy, or click on the **"COPY"** button [on a MAC you would use the "Command + C" buttons]):
5. Login to Blackboard.
6. Navigate to the content area or folder where you wish to add your video.

9. In the Source Code editor window, paste the text that was copied in Step 4 (Ctrl+V or right-click >Paste [on a MAC you would use the “Command + V” buttons]) then click “**Save**”.
